Meet the IRSPM Conference Manager



As the architect of the society's conference strategy, the **Conference Manager** plays a key role in orchestrating both virtual and physical editions of IRSPM's Annual Conferences. This dynamic position involves a blend of strategic planning and hands-on management, ensuring each conference is not only a reflection of our high standards, but also a platform for advancing the field of public management.

Dr. Lode De Waele (1986), IRSPM Conference Manager since 2023, studied business administration and obtained his PhD at the faculty of Business and Economics of the University of Antwerp (Belgium). He started his PhD in 2013, after being employed in the public sector for several years as an accountant, cabinet member, and senior consultant.



His main research interests are hybrid organizations and integrity among public sector employees. From 2020 to July 2021, he has been enrolled as an advisor on Fiscal policies and Budget at the Federal Parliament of Belgium. From August 2021 - 2022, he has been employed as a lecturer and researcher at the department of Organization Studies at Tilburg University (the Netherlands). Since October 2022, he has been appointed as Assistant Professor at Utrecht University School of Governance, where he joined the department of Strategic HRM. Given his professional background, bridging theory and practice and ensuring impact are central objectives in his work.

A view from the South: Increasing IRSPM's footprint on the African Continent



In this issue, we bring you a unique view on public management issues on the African continent, and insights into the opportunities to increase IRSPM's footprint on the African Continent, offered by IRSPM's **VP Africa**, **Greg Davids**. Greg works at the University of the Western Cape situated in Cape Town South Africa. Cape Town is a coastal city at the southern tip of the African continent. He is based at the School of Government and currently holds the position of Deputy Dean for Learning and Teaching within the Economic and Management Sciences Faculty. His work experience encompasses both the public as well as the private sector (more specifically, the financial sector).

Greg entered academia in 1993. His research interests are policy formulation, implementation, and how organizations function, with a particular focus on governance. In his quest to understand governance, he served on various boards in different sectors over the years. For instance, besides serving on a hospital board, Greg chaired a non-governmental organization (NGO), served on State own Entities (SOE) such as the Nuclear board of South Africa (NECSA), the Overberg Water Board, and The Catholic Welfare Organization. He purposely chose this path in order to assess the applicability of theory in practice, to understand governance in practice, and to explore whether there are common elements of governance in various sectors.

Greg consulted the public sector and provided expert input in different strategic workshops, e.g. the Small business Development of South Africa (SEDA) or the South African Local Government association (SALGA) of Northern Cape. He contributed to different capacity development programs for Labor unions, e.g. the Police Labour Union (POPCRU) or Mining workers. Gregs academic journey includes a degree in development studies, the Program for Management development (Harvard Business School), and studies at the Institute of Public Administration in France.
